The Rohloff family's story



"I was my parent's first child, and soon after me they welcomed into the world my sister and then my brother. For a mere seventeen months after, we were one big happy family."

That was the introduction Robert Rohloff of Morris, Minnesota, wrote in his application essay to the SFM Foundation.

Robert's father died in a plane crash on a business trip in 2003, leaving behind a wife, Stephanie, and three children ages five, three and one.

The Rohloffs have felt the immense shift that comes with the loss of a parent, but they haven't let that hold them back from achieving their goals.

After hearing about the Foundation, Robert applied and was accepted for a scholarship to attend the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities. A few years later, his sister Morgan received a Foundation scholarship for her studies at the University of Minnesota, Morris.
